

## CHAPTER 5

### So what exactly is Naked Leadership?

**Lead** (verb): Cause to feel, think or behave in a certain way. To guide or direct. To go before...

**Lead** (noun): Soft heavy dense grey substance, often used for weighing things down.

Both words are spelled the same way (if pronounced a little differently) and each also shares some characteristics of leaders I have worked for. How about you?

I choose to believe that it is not only a matter of *what* we think leadership is but also *how* it is carried out that makes the difference. That's why, at the risk of inviting a cliché about writers and the overuse of Eastern philosophy, I would like to offer some gems of wisdom written by Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu.

While they were expressed over 2,500 years ago, these observations are just as accurate and applicable in the 21st century as the day they were penned (or quilled) and were instrumental in the formulation of the philosophy behind *Naked Leadership*.
